10am Located on the Historic Route 20, Petersen & Tietz Greenhouse is an 83 year old business operated by the third generation. Depending on the season, you will learn about poinsettias, lily's, and spring and fall gardening. petersenandtietz.com

11am A knowledgeable guide will join your group at Petersen & Teitz and will enlighten you on the history of Waterloo and Cedar Falls as you travel Historic Route 20 from Petersen & Teitz Greenhouse to Barn Happy. Noon Arrive at Barn Happy where your group will enjoy lunch and shopping in a renovated dairy barn.



1:30pm Tour the Ice House Museum located on the banks of the Cedar River. The circular building, built in 1921 once stored ice cut from the Cedar River. It now features interactive displays that tell the ice harvesting story. cfhistory.org

2:30pm Take a step back in time as you tour the Oster Regent Theatre and the Black Hawk Hotel located in the 100 block of Main Street. These sites are on the National Register of Historic Places. The Black Hawk Hotel is the oldest, continuous operating hotel in the state of Iowa. osterregent.com & theblackhawkhotel.com

3:30pm Meander on Main Street; there's something for everyone—from locally owned specialty shops, coffee and tea, public art exhibits, historic buildings and Riverwalk. communitymainstreet.org

9:30am The Sullivan Brothers Iowa Veterans Museum Honors the service and sacrifice of all Iowa veterans from Civil War to present. Step into their stories through traditional exhibits, interactive activities and an electronic Wall of Honor. An exhibit of the Sullivan living room honors the five Sullivan brothers of Waterloo, Iowa who were serving together on the USS Juneau and lost their lives are part of Waterloo's and the nation's history. groutmuseumdistrict.org
